News from the Town Board

Along with conducting the regular monthly business, the Town Board has been working on the following:

- A Public Hearing was held on June 5th for residents to speak on any concerns regarding amending Ordinance 101. At the regular meeting following the Public Hearing, the Board adopted an amendment to the ordinance to reduce the side setback from 30' to 15' and to remove the no variance clause.
- At the regular July meeting the Board authorized a citizen Advisory Committee to examine issues related to Ordinance 101. (See story on next page.) So far in 2019, the Township has issued 14 permits.
- Lease Landscaping completed the preparation work for landscaping around the Town Hall. Planting will commence
 in the spring of 2020.
- The Board heard from residents of Lydia Lane who inquired about the procedures for establishing a township road.
- At the request of a resident, the Board has undertaken an investigation of the science and best practices regarding dust control and the impact of various products on vegetation and water. To date we've talked with staff at Itasca Soil & Water, The University of Minnesota's Extension Services and Center for Transportation Studies, MnDOT's Research Division, and the Minnesota Local Road Research Board. - For Memorial Day, the township places American flags on the graves of veterans interred in Wabana Cemetery. Clerk Fordham (ruthwabanaclerk@yahoo.com or 218-259-0228) asks that residents let her know of any veteran buried in our cemetery so that we can make sure all are honored with a flag.

Ordinance 101 Update

A group of volunteers has come together to form the Wabana Township Advisory Committee to help define, update, and recommend revisions to Wabana Township's Zoning Ordinance. This committee was authorized by the Wabana Township Supervisors at the July monthly meeting. The group's members are: Deb Kee, Wayne Speedling, Bob Moore, Gary Oja (Secretary), Jim Corrigan, Jim Olijnek, Steve Melin (Chairperson), and Steve Bjerke (Township Supervisor).

The group meets a couple times a month and we have defined the following goals:

- Review and assess Wabana Township Ordinance 101 and make recommendations to the Wabana Township Board in regard to that assessment.
- Develop shoreland overlay rules and regulations that would best work with the mission of protecting the water quality both from a recreational and economic standpoint for all Wabana Township lakes.
- To develop and strengthen Wabana Township's working relationship with the Itasca County Board of Commissioners and Environmental Services Department, the DNR, and Itasca County Soil and Water.
- To formalize a relationship with the Wabana Chain of Lakes Association (WCOLA).
- Develop a long-term comprehensive Land Use Plan. This plan would address and identify a multitude of local zoning concerns including water surface zoning within the Township moving forward.


