2014 ANNUAL MEETING NEWS

Wabana's 2014 Annual Meeting was held on March 11th. Residents in attendance elected Marvin Ott to chair the meeting and acted on the following:

Approved the 2015 Levy:

General: \$61,300 Fire: \$22,000

Road & Bridge: \$42,700 Reserve: \$1,000

• Road Contracts

The contract for plowing and dust control was awarded to Itasca County, and the contract for grading was awarded to Wm. Schwartz, and Sons.

• Service Contracts

Citizens supported requests for service contracts from: Itasca Little League, First Call for Help, Elder Circle, Home Visitor Program, Itasca County Agricultural Association, Itasca County Historical Society, MN Highway 38 Leadership Board, Support Within Reach, and Second Harvest Food Bank. After a presentation from members of the Itasca Water Legacy Partnership about their initiative to educate Wabana Lake boaters about preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species, township residents voted to support the request and instructed supervisors to proceed with research and implementation.

2013 ANNUAL MEETING

There were not many who attended Wabana's Annual Meeting, but we are grateful to those who took the time to attend!

Wabana residents who attended the meeting approved the following levy for 2014:

General \$57,900 Road & Bridge \$42,000 Fire \$24,000 Reserve \$1,500

The total levy is approximately \$20,000 more than last year because we are putting aside \$10,000 to re-do the rink and another \$10,000 to repave the Hall parking lot.

Low-Interest loans available to upgrade septic systems

Commissioner Terry Snyder informs the Wabana Town Board at a recent meeting that Itasca County has a low interest loan program to upgrade septics. Here's the article about the program from the MPA:

"The Minnesota Department of Agriculture has \$20 million available for low-interest loans to help farmers and rural landowners finance projects that prevent or reduce water pollution.

The funding is made available through the MDA's Agricultural Best Management Practices (AgBMP) Loan Program and is available in all counties in the state. The AgBMP Loan Program works with Soil and Water Conservation Districts and local governments to help farmers, rural landowners and agriculture-related businesses solve pollution problems by offering loans at three percent interest through participating local lenders.

All practices that reduce water pollution are eligible, such as fixing septic systems, replacing contaminated wells, upgrading livestock facilities, constructing erosion control structures, purchasing conservation tillage equipment, improving chemical application and storage methods, and adopting other water-related best management practices."

Residents gathered on Tuesday, March 8th at the Town Hall for the Annual Meeting. Gary Oja was elected moderator. Among township business discussed: supervisor Sage reported on township roads and residents voted to award the contract for grading to Schwartz & Sons. The snowplow contract was awarded to Itasca County. Ideas for new projects were discussed including finishing the tennis court installation this spring, refinishing the floor in the hall, saving for new playground equipment, and preparing to rehab the boards on the rink.



After discussion, residents voted on the 2012 Levy:

Road and Bridge: \$37,000

Fire: \$24,200 General: \$51,500 Reserve: \$1,500

A report was made on progress in revising cemetery rules and regulations to allow for monuments and markers, as well as providing specifics regarding burial of cremation urns.

2nd Public Meeting about Wabana Dam and Fish Passage held on Oct. 5, 2010

A public meeting was held to discuss a proposed fish passage at the Wabana Dam and the Wabana Creek Crossing at Itasca Co. 49 on Tuesday, October 5th at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall.

Eric Raitanen, US Forest Service, and Jeff Tillman, DNR presented information about a unique opportunity to improve fish passage at the Wabana dam by building natural rock weirs at and below the present dam. This change would not alter the level of Wabana but would improve the walleye and northern pike fishery in the chain by increasing genetic diversity. Raitanen and Tillman presented

ideas, provided examples, fielded questions, and gathered comments to aid in the development of the project. For information contact Eric Raitanen at 246-3475.


Seeking Your Input on Wabana Cemetery Rules & Regulations


