Wabana Township Recreation Projects

The Wabana Township Recreation Committee has been very busy working to improve the recreation facilities in the township. The projects include improvements to the playground equipment, tennis court, hockey rink, new pickle ball court, and more.

The Committee has consulted with Sarah Carling, regional director of Community Economic Development Associates (CEDA) on fundraising and grant opportunities. With much support from the community, the township has raised \$276,000, including grants from the Blandin Foundation (\$50,000); the IRRR (\$30,000), and other generous donors. News on the DNR grant status should come in early July.

You won't want to miss the *Pancake Breakfast* fundraiser on Saturday, July 8 from 9-11 at town hall. A freewill offering is requested to support the project. A breakfast feast is planned, including gluten free options.

Boat Wash Decontamination Station

Residents and visitors are encouraged to use the free hot water boat wash station to help stop the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) in our area lakes. The boat wash station is located at Town Hall (entrance at 30980 Clearwater Road) and is open Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays through the summer and into early fall from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Any personal watercraft, including kayaks, paddle boards, jet skis, boats, may be cleaned at this station. DNR certified Level II AIS Inspectors will staff the station during open hours. The inspectors may educate watercraft owners, provide inspections, and perform decontamination procedures on watercraft and trailers contaminated with aquatic invasive species (AIS).

You can help stop the spread of aquatic invasive species by taking these three steps every time you leave a lake or river - whether or not it's infested:

- **Clean** all aquatic plants, zebra mussels, and other invasive species from boats, trailers, and water-related equipment.
- **Drain** water from your boat, ballast tanks, motor, live well and bait container. Remove drain plugs and keep drain plugs out while transporting equipment.
- **Dispose** of unwanted bait in the trash. To keep live bait, drain the water and refill the bait container with bottled or tap water.
