Attend the Town Board Annual Meeting Tuesday, March 12 at 7 p.m.

Residents may participate in their township government at the Wabana Township Annual Meeting on Tuesday, March 12 at 7 p.m. The annual meeting will be held in person and by <u>Zoom</u>. At the annual meeting, permanent residents can vote on the recommended levy. At the January budget meeting, the board discussed the 2024 budget and will consider the following recommended levy at the March 12 annual meeting:

General Fund	85,045
Road & Bridge.	37,150
Fire	<u>32,000</u>
Total	\$154,195

The increase includes +\$3,000 for fire protection (\$29K to \$32K) and +\$6,000 for the three elections paid for by the Township (Presidential Primary, Election Primary, and General) The 2023 levy was \$150,595.

Wabana Recreational Complex

Did you ever watch that show as a kid 'Where in the World is Carmen Sandiago?' Are you thinking 'Where in the World is that new Wabana recreational complex?' Well, my friends, good news is on the horizon. I know, I know, we've been at this for 3 years. Seems like a lifetime ago. But we are on the cusp of turning a big corner.

After a major pledge drive, several fundraisers, and awarded grants, we have broken the \$310,000 mark! Our complete project goal is \$480,000. You can see we are about \$170,000 off our goal. The support from the township has been overwhelming. Thank you all so very very much. The committee members have averaged 10-12 people/meeting and are committed to seeing this project achieve its goals.

Now refer to the Insert for the diagram (or the third page of this file if you're viewing electronically). This is what the playground will look like. Yes, that's a zipline, and a double wide slide! Not a huge playground but a lot of fun pieces I'm sure the kiddos will enjoy. A huge thanks to this committee of 19 volunteers and all their hard work. Also, to school district 318 for the donated central playground structure. Saved us a huge amount of additional costs.

We've been working with an engineering firm and now have gotten the exact details needed to obtain estimates for the overall project. A huge thank you to Steve Bjerke, Wayne Speedling, and Gary Oja for getting the numbers together for that all important *next step*....The attachment shows the playground has been moved to the current tennis court location. A kiddy rink has been added to the west end of the hockey rink (+ lights), Tennis and separate Pickleball courts have been added to the north side of the hockey rink, a 30' x 30' cement pad has been added for Basketball, and an ADA accessible walking trail has been included to connect all these areas. Whew.

Next step: We are in the process now of applying (again) for a grant from the DNR. We were told that we were very close to being awarded this grant last year, so we will try one more time. If we are successful, then all the above becomes a reality.

So now for some more good news. Most recently we've had an anonymous donor step forward and offer a dollar match up to \$15,000! What a gift! \$15 turns into \$30. We want to thank everyone that has already pledged or donated. We would like to use this matching donation to ask for any additional donations or increase your pledge so we can leverage this matching donation. The donor is even willing to contribute \$100 for every person who donates time (volunteers) during the rebuild (kids included!). So, a family of 4 = \$400. Maybe you can rake, paint, or swing a hammer, there will be plenty of opportunities to help. And just last week we had **another** anonymous donor gift us \$10,000 (they don't live here anymore but have fond memories of this area as children). Maybe there are others who want to invest in Wabana's recreational future too?

Here's one last suggestion for us older folks. One way to contribute to the recreation project is called Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your retirement plan like an IRA or 401(k). When you reach 70 ½ years of age, the tax law allows you to transfer your distribution yearly to a charity, <u>tax-free</u>. If you have not contributed to the Wabana Recreation Project, this would be one way of doing that. If you have contributed already (thank you), then this can be another way to make an additional contribution. If you are considering this way of contributing, please contact your tax advisor to make sure you are eligible, and the proper procedures are followed. Oh, *and if you've made a pledge and not paid the pledge yet...now's the time*.



Wabana Beach

You may or may not be aware that Wabana Township manages a beach and picnic area on the south shore of Wabana Lake. It is located about 2 miles west of Town Hall on Co. Rd. 60 (Clearwater Road), turn on McLaughlin Drive, just a short drive in you will then see the sign and gate for Wabana Beach. Wabana Township leases the land from Itasca County and is responsible for the area's maintenance. The Township keeps the grass mowed, the picnic tables in good shape, places sand at the beach area as needed, repair the grounds as needed, and pump the holding tank. Yes, there is a small blockhouse there with a toilet and changing room. The beach has a nice gentle sandy slope into the water for swimming, a few picnic tables and a fire ring for eating. Whether you use the beach area in the spring, summer, fall or as access to the lake in the winter, the township thanks you for keeping all trash picked up and disposed of properly to help maintain a clean beach area and lake.
